**The proposals in a nutshell:** The Sunnybank Park Working Group want the St Machar Outdoor Centre to be kept as public greenspace and renamed Sunnybank Park. We would improve access by making new entrances and steps and by improving the paths and putting in a circular walk around the park. We want to plant more trees, make a community orchard and keep open areas of grass. We would make a new allotment site for local people. We would restore the tennis courts and keep the children's play area. We want to make a secure area for dog walking and put in dog bins. We would restore the Gibberie Wallie and make a formal garden in front of it. The University will manage their adjacent land as a wildlife garden with access from Sunnybank Park. We will try to raise funds for a new community building to replace the pavilion.
